## Our Common Past



Each of us dreams of making a difference. In that first small group of Anglicans that arrived in what is now the environs of Toronto in 1793, you see men and women, a rich amalgam of people of outstanding talents and determination, making small and large differences, differences we still

The Anglican Diocese of Toronto can be compared to a rich tapestry, a tapestry woven by its people, building places of worship, some of which are still outstanding architectural jewels. An early encouragement and patronage of the arts and crafts persists to this day with tangible evidence in beautiful vestments, superb silver work, and its choirs and organists amongst the best in the land.

Deeply committed to a strong and just society, its early clergy and lay people joined to build a hospital, university and schools, and then, as now, it sought to help not only its own congregations, but to help the needy, the sick, the elderly.

## Together in Faith and Hope

The Diocese of Toronto was founded in 1839 and over the years has responded compassionately and prophetically to God’s mission to draw all people to the light of Christ. It is the most populous of the 30 dioceses in the Anglican Church of Canada, comprising 238 congregations in 204 parishes located throughout South Central Ontario.

The Diocese includes the fastest-growing suburban region in Canada and also covers a large rural area. The Diocese is home to many culturally diverse and language-based congregations, and serves thousands of people each year through its parish and diocesan programs. Across the Diocese more than 78,000 people are served at our food-banks and outreach services, and more than 24,900 bed-nights are provided to those in need, through homeless shelters and Out of the Cold programs.

Every year new people are joining our churches. They are excited about God’s mission and enthusiastic about Anglican values and ministries. During the past 10 years, Anglicans of all ages were engaged in the work of the Church, giving generously to its ministries, and vigorously committed to the Gospel of Christ. Truly God is making all things new in the Diocese of Toronto.

Today, our Church and parish communities are faced with new needs and blessed with exciting opportunities to respond to God’s call to draw all people to the light of Christ. We possess valuable resources, but the needs of our communities call us to do more. We must keep our parishes strong, continue to teach our faith, and reach out to those in need.

## The Fund

The Anglican Diocese of Toronto Foundation was incorporated as a public Foundation in 1999, to provide financial support for the Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Toronto, or any parish of the Diocese.

As at December 31, 2010 the Foundation retained assets of nearly \$7.5-million. In 2010 a total of \$241,205 was distributed in the Diocese of Toronto.

In order to support the diocese, the Foundation has established several endowment funds, whose income funds vary. These include:

### **The Anglican Diocese of Toronto Fund**

This general fund provides income to support education and research; leadership development and support; building maintenance, restoration and re-fittings; and, ecumenical and inter-faith outreach.

### **Endowment to Fund the Office of the Bishop of Toronto**

To support the general purposes and programmes of the Office of the Bishop of Toronto.

### **Endowment to Fund FaithWorks**

To support the Annual Social Service Ministry Campaign of the Diocese of Toronto.

### **Anglican Community Development Fund**

The income from the endowment fund will be forwarded each year undivided to a single parish or ministry to assist youth or families in need.
