Questions to consider as you plan for a new worship service:

Do we have the critical mass to begin?

- people to lead music, set-up & take-down,
- people to perform other necessary tasks (eg. run computer/projector, set-up for Eucharist, administer bread and wine, preach/teach, lead prayers, read Scripture etc.)
- people to 'seed' this new worship service

Where will we hold it?

- is the space proposed conducive to worship?
- is the space suitable for the number of people coming?
- will the space and set-up allow us to do what we are proposing to do?

What new resources might we need?

- hardware eg. sound system, projector, computer
- software eg. projection presentation program
- new musical instruments and space for these
- liturgical references and resources

Every new venture involves both pain and possibility. Have we considered both of these thoroughly?

- what are the possibilities? (Who might we reach that we are not now reaching? How might this challenge, energize and grow all of us?)
- what pain can we foresee arising? (splitting of congregation, smaller attendance at other services, reallocation of some resources, shifts in furniture, fear of loosing Anglican heritage, service-envy)
