Major Responsibilities:

- Support the implementation of the annual fund development plan for FaithWorks.
- Continue to build strategic partnerships with clergy and lay leaders.
- Conduct prospect research of foundations, individuals and corporations.
- Oversee the annual creation, production, and distribution of fundraising materials.
- Coordinate existing direct-mail solicitations to renewal donors and prospects.
- Support record-keeping and with the Donor Relations and Information Management Assistant ensure timely gift acknowledgement.
- Attend stewardship development events and meetings.
- Prepare reports, agendas, notices and minutes for the FaithWorks Allocations Committee. This includes presenting workshops to groups of various sizes.
- Represents Stewardship Development internally and externally at the request of the Director.
- Other duties as assigned.

The successful candidate must have 3-5 years of experience working in a fundraising environment with exposure to annual giving. University or College graduate with additional fundraising certification or equivalent preferred.

The Diocese is seeking a full-time Annual Giving Coordinator. **This is a contract position that will continue until December 31, 2019.** The successful candidate for this position will have strong writing skills, great attention to detail, the ability to take initiative, and excellent oral and written communication skills in English. The candidate must be a self-started with strong organizational skills, able to work in a team and with volunteers, meet deadlines, handle multiple tasks, maintain confidentiality and some project management experience. This position requires proficiency with Microsoft Office, e-mail and the Internet, and Raisers' Edge. This position requires familiarity with the Anglican Church, including a thorough understanding of Church structure, processes, relationships, and vocabulary is an asset.
