Authorized Liturgies

Liturgies authorized by the bishops for use in public services in the Diocese of Toronto are the following:

- 1. The *Book of Common Prayer (BCP)* (1959) remains the official Prayer Book of the Anglican Church of Canada, and its use must not be denied our people.
- 2. The *Book of Alternative Services (BAS)* is the official alternative to the *Book of Common Prayer* and its use should not be denied our people.
- 3. Because the *Book of Alternative Services* comes as the fruition of a long period of liturgical experimentation in our church, liturgical rites, previously authorized for use in the diocese, are no longer authorized. These rites include the following:
 - i) The Canadian Anglican Liturgical Series, including the Third Canadian Eucharist, the Marriage Rite and the Burial Rite.
 - ii) The Book of Common Prayer of the Episcopal Church of the United States of America.
 - iii) The Church of England Liturgical Series 1, 2 and 3, and the Alternative Services Book of the Church of England.
- 4. Use of prayer books from other Anglican provinces in languages other than English must also be authorized by the area bishop.
- 5. Exceptions to the above ruling are as follows:
 - i) Because the *Book of Alternative Services* does not contain an Induction Rite, the alternative is provided in Section 2.
 - ii) The provisions for combining baptism and/or confirmation with the eucharist, according to the *Book of Common Prayer* are found in Section 2.
 - iii) The Third Collect appointed for Good Friday, p.174 of the *Book of Common Prayer* is no longer authorized and will be omitted.
- 6. The bishops strongly support the recommendation of General Synod 1983 that the ecumenical lectionary contained in the *Book of Alternative Services* or the *Revised Common Lectionary* (1992) authorized by General Synod 1995 be used, even where the usual Sunday liturgy is from the *Book of Common Prayer*. The only authorized lectionaries are those contained in the *Book of Common Prayer*, the *Book of Alternative Services*, and the *Revised Common Lectionary* (1992). Others may only be used with the approval of the bishops.
- 7. No other authorized rites should be used without the express permission of the area bishop.
- 8. The liturgies contained in the *Book of Occasional Celebrations* (Canada) have not been authorized for use in public liturgies in the Diocese of Toronto. They may be used only after consultation with the area bishop.
