1. Introduction – Our Diocese Connects

There can be little doubt that we live in a world which is interconnected, intra-dependent and interrelated. As Christians, we hold to the biblical imperatives to love our neighbour and that all people are created and adored by God.

Our baptismal vows bring us into the neighbourhood of other Christians and call us to go where Jesus goes. As Anglicans, we have a particular history of reaching out to God's people as part of God's mission through God's Church to God's world.

This is the second survey designed to help us understand how we make “connections” with our wider Anglican world. Here are the “connections” 107 of our parishes make. Our Church, the Anglican Diocese of Toronto, is engaged with people we have never met, who live in countries we have never visited, who speak languages we do not understand, all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are part of a wider family, the human family, God's family.

The results of the survey reveal a staggering number of “connections” and the commitment, bedrock for Anglicans, to seek to make a difference in God's world. Of particular note are the connections to our First Nations brothers and sisters, joining in their journey.

Gina Bearne, my assistant, has compiled this data and presented it in an accessible and informative way. Take time to browse its pages, to be inspired by its results.

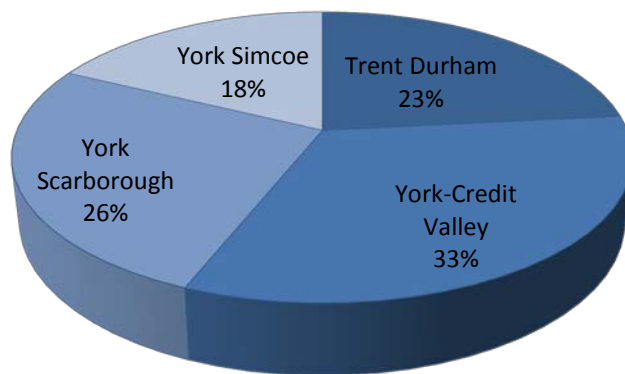

2. Survey Response

An invitation was sent to all parishes in the Diocese of Toronto to participate in this survey. Out of the 194 parishes in the Diocese, 107 (55.2%) responded, taking this opportunity to share with others the scope of their outreach work.

NOTE: Some parishes submitted more than one response. The data has been 'cleansed' to reflect only one entry from each parish, but, where possible, information has been combined from multiple entries.

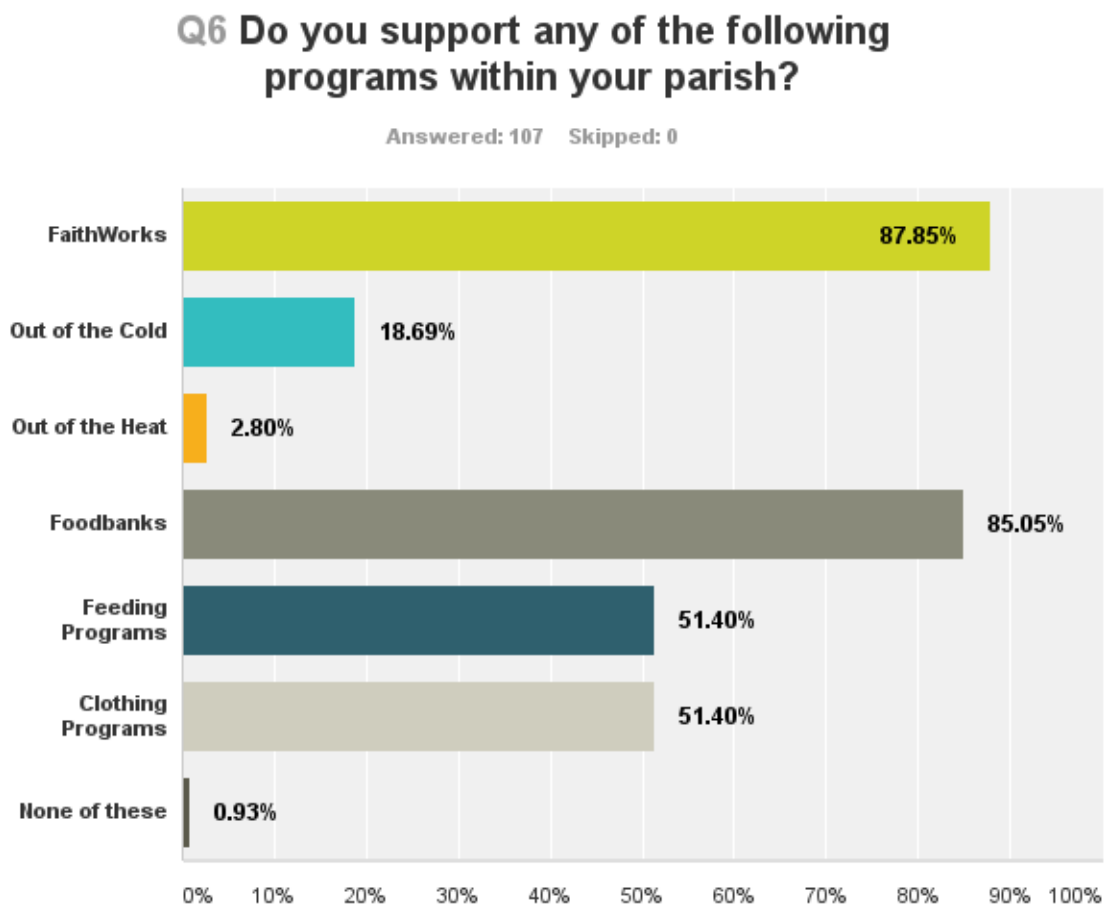
Respondents by Episcopal Area

We asked whether parishes support specific programs:

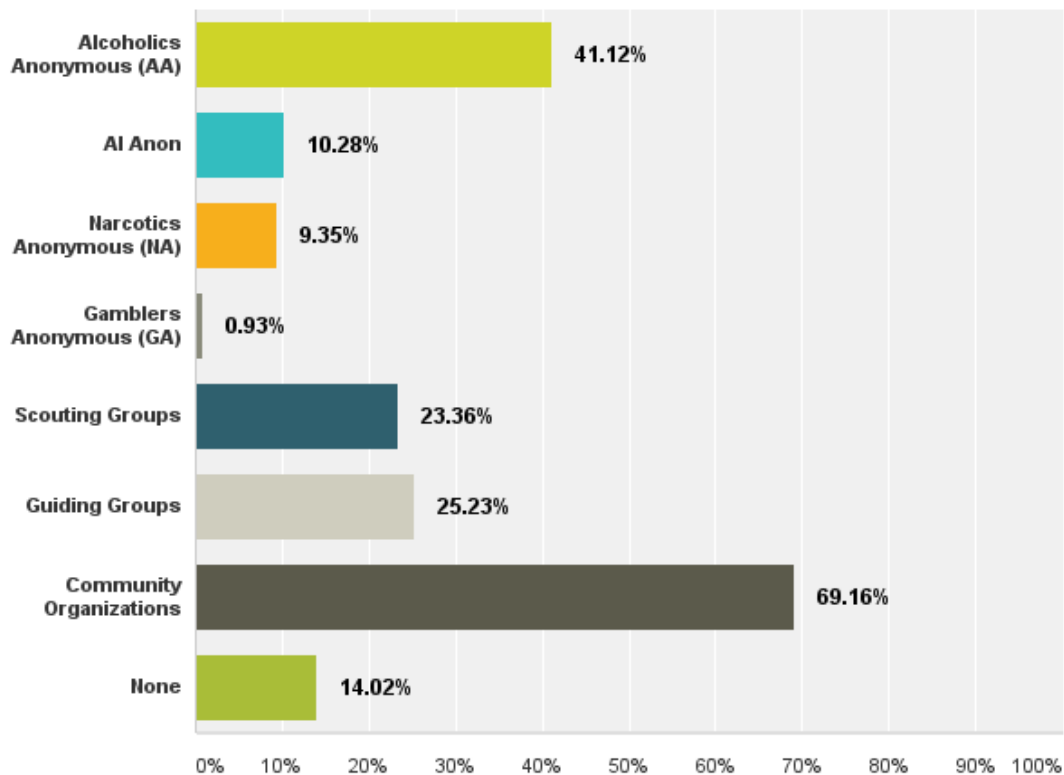

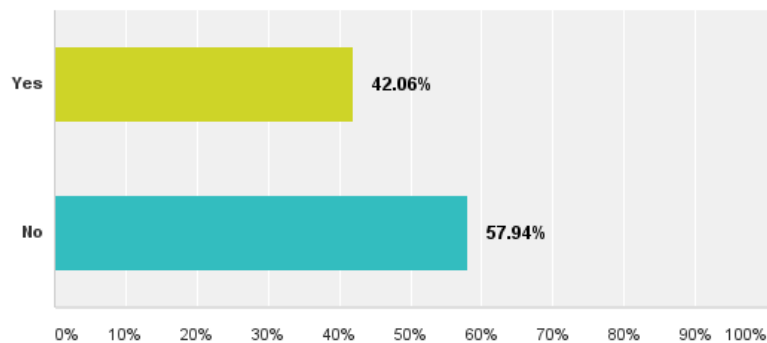

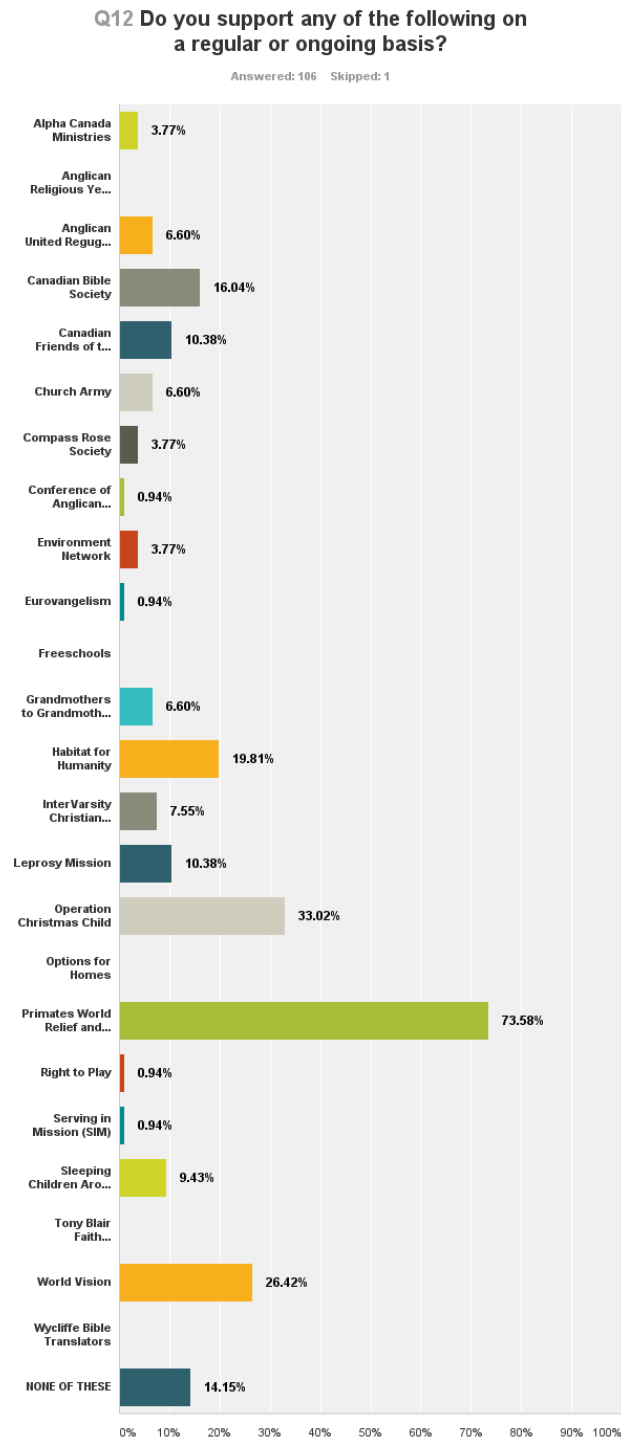

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

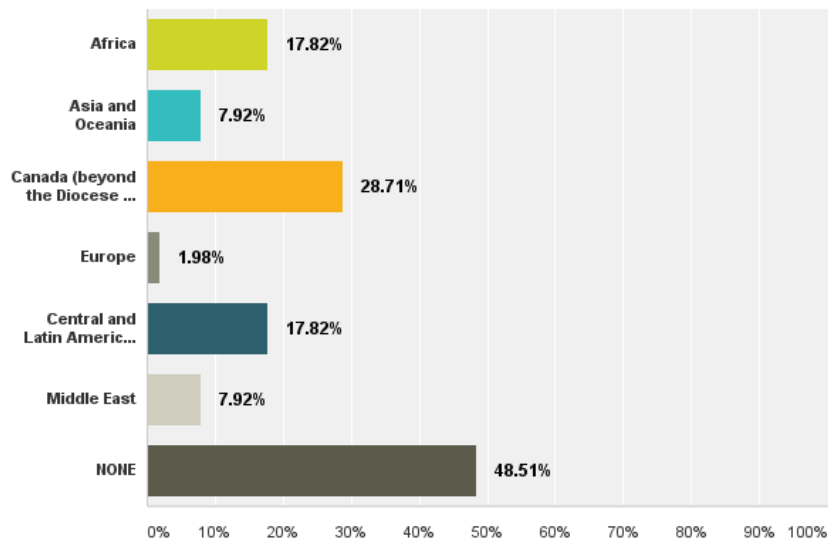

Secondary school costs money and yearly fees for university are some \$500 plus monthly expenses. Kenyan Outreach supports 3 primary pupils, 4 secondary school and one university student.

We are beginning our ninth year with our partner church of St. Mark's in Mzuzu. While feeding is still our prime purpose we are continuing to develop this program in response to needs expressed by our partners in Africa. Our health care efforts now include preventative measures as well as daily dental and medical care. Our education program has expanded to offer training in tailoring as well as tin-smithing. We provide warm winter clothing and new shoes to each of our 250 children at the beginning of each winter season.

One of the most remarkable and rewarding aspects of this outreach has been the financial support that we receive from our parish and our community beyond the walls of St. Peter's Church. Of the \$60,000 that we send annually, more than 60% comes from outside our parish which is a testament to the success of this program and the trust we have been slowly building with friends and neighbours. Our co-ordinating committee has members from three other denominations and we receive support from several churches in nearby towns.

While nothing can last forever we trust that we will continue to be able to help these children for many years to come.

The aim is to outfit at least 10 homes a year with clean and accessible water and wastewater provisions. The Advent Conspiracy campaign for the Pikangikum Water Project will be the focus of our 2014 Advent sermon series (four weeks) with a guest speaker as well.
