# **Leadership Development**

#### **Wycliffe College**

\$25,000 for a pilot project titled *Christian Foundations for Lay Leadership – Faith, Church, Service and Teaching.* The proposal is designed to build up "a sound and broad-based knowledge of faith, church and mission among laypeople." Since our first allocations were made in early 2013, more parishes have been awarded grants in the area of Communicating in a Wireless World than any other. Nearly \$500,000 has been awarded to 30 projects. These creative efforts allow parishes to upgrade or create websites, enhance multimedia communications to make worship services more accessible and diverse, install new audio systems and develop mobile apps to complement faith formation outside of Sunday worship.

# Adaptive Reuse



St. Paul, Minden received a grant to construct an addition to their existing Parish Hall in order to better, and more safely, accommodate current use, while also expanding their program and ministry offerings with a variety of new community initiatives.

#### St. George Memorial, Oshawa

\$35,000 was awarded to undertake the installation of an exterior accessibility ramp and modify an existing internal ramp. Further, the parish is hoping to replace existing entrance doors that have begun to rot and are not energy-efficient.

# Enabling Parishes to Become Multi-Staffed



St. Mary Magdalene received a grant of \$75,000 to hire a part-time associate priest responsible for children and youth work. The parish is finding new ways to connect with its youngest members, thanks to the leadership of the Rev. Jennifer Schick.

# Communicating in a Wireless World



St. Hilda, Fairbanks received a grant of \$20,000 to set up a broad-cast centre in the parish. A mix of programs, including worship services and specials events from the church, and presentations from the staff on things like cooking, health, fitness and medicine, will be available in all 500 rooms of the attached retirement home and the church.

# **Pioneering Ministry**

#### St. Paul, L'Amoreaux

\$60,000 to establish a chapel ministry at Silversprings Park, a large, low-income rental complex located at Finch and Birchmount in Scarborough. The Chapel will offer weekly services and pastoral care, a satellite office for St. Paul's L'Amoreaux Centre, Christian study and service, and enhance the development of community support programs.
