#### SYNOD COUNCIL'S REPORT TO SYNOD

#### Scope of Report

This is the report of the Synod Council to the members of the 162<sup>nd</sup> Regular Session of Synod. This report covers the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023. During this period, Synod Council held two hybrid meetings, seven video conference calls using Zoom, and had two email polls for a total of 11 meetings. September 28, 2023 Synod Council approved this report.

## **Policy Matters and Major Items Discussed or Approved** (in alphabetical order)

#### • Capital Redeployment grants





During the height of the pandemic, Diocesan Council raised funds by approving the sale of vacant land using the proceeds to support parishes. Members reflected on the impact and effects of the grant funds offered to the parishes and how they have helped.

#### • Cast and Learn Grants

Cast and Learn grants address a gap in our program and would allow a parish to ask for funding between \$10,000 and \$40,000. These grants allow parishes to try new projects and test new ideas.

#### • Celebrating Black History Month

Members were provided with an overview of the origin of the annual observance of Black History month worldwide and in Canada. The 2023 Black History month theme is "Ours to tell" and focused on the positive impact that people of African heritage have individually and collectively made, and are still making to life in Canada.

#### • Changing Church

Council members enjoyed watching a video on the Anglican Church of Canada's new strategic planning initiative to explore the theme "A Changing Church, A Searching World and a Faithful God", which will help unify Canadian Anglicans in embracing the future with confidence and faith. Members were briefed on the learnings received from the national church process and the power of discernment, the power of listening, the power of being in discipleship and the value of an aspirational approach. All the pieces of the strategic initiative came into being when the life of Christ was put in the Centre.

#### • FaithWorks

Synod Council approved the FaithWorks Goal for 2023 of \$1,500,000.

#### • Hybrid Work Policy

The COVID-19 pandemic was a time of many changes for the Diocese of Toronto and its staff. One of the learnings from this period is that while staff can generally work successfully from home, working in the office is still valuable. The Diocese implemented a Hybrid Work Policy and updated our Flexible Hours Policy to reflect this new situation.

#### • Leadership Giving

Giving by leaders is normative, expected and viewed as an honourable practice. Our Director of Stewardship Development discussed the important role that leaders play in modelling generosity. Giving is done from the top to the bottom, inside out, and it means that for any fundraising effort





to be successful, the leadership team must project and model that the vision of the organization.

#### • Master Agreement for Redevelopment Projects

In March 2023, Synod Council approved a Master Agreement that sets out a process and fee structure, and defines the framework for working with Kindred Works. Each new project will follow the same general process which will comply with Canon 6 and will require Synod Council approval. It will avoid the need to recreate a new process for each build, reducing the project timeline, the burden of parish volunteer time, and the need to be subject matter experts in property development. On completion of the project, facility management agreements will be arranged with Kindred Works, avoiding the burden to the parish of managing a building.

#### • Process and Planning Group

The Process and Planning Group continued its work in shaping and planning the agendas for meetings of the Synod Council.

#### • Quarterly Fiduciary Reports

Council members received regular quarterly fiduciary reports consisting of a Litigation Report, Compliance Certificate and Financial Results.

#### - Parish Administration, Amalgamations, and other Arrangements

#### • Canon 24 – Diocesan Administration of Parishes

#### • St. Andrew, Japanese and St. David, Donlands

At its October 20, 2022 meeting, Synod Council approved the voluntary amalgamation of St. David, Donlands and St. Andrew, Japanese. In December 2022, Charles Cutts was appointed the Administrator to help the parish navigate the amalgamation process.

#### • St. Bartholomew, Toronto

This parish has been under diocesan administration since 2012 under Canon 24. Kevin Forrest continues to serve as the Administrator.

#### • St Chad

In March 2022, Council approved that St. Chad be immediately placed under Canon 24. Since October 2022, Philip Conliffe has served as the Administrator and is carrying out the function of receiver and manager.
