Introduction

Jesus said to them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. John 21.6

The invitation by Jesus to "Cast the Net" has been our summons too. Since the middle of 2022 we have been invited to gather, to pray and to reflect on ministry in the Diocese of Toronto as we step into a new time, post pandemic. This process has been ably led by the Cast the Net Steering committee, co-chaired by The Rev'd Alison Falby and Mr. Dave Toycen ODT and by our consultants Canon Ian Alexander, Ms. Anita Gittens ODT, The Very Rev'd Peter Elliott and Dr. Sarah Johnson. We have gleaned insights, dreams, hopes, concerns and experiences of hundreds of clergy and laity in large and small parishes from every corner of the Diocese. And from this gathering of reflections and experiences is an emerging vision for how we are being summoned to serve in the future. A full report of the committee's findings and recommendations will be presented at Synod.

Follow me, is the last word Jesus gives to the disciples in Chapter 21 of the Gospel of John. Following Jesus is at the heart of all that we strive to do in our mutual ministry. Building on the ministry initiatives of 2023 and the emerging vision of Cast the Net we strive to move forward in faith.

The Season of Renewal

Surfacing from all that was gleaned in the listening process of Cast the Net was a desire for us to deepen our call to discipleship, formation, prayer and worship.

- The Season of Renewal will take place in 2024-2025
- Congregations, ministries and missions in every part of the Diocese will be invited to participate in worship, study, prayer and renewal events.
- Funds from an Our Faith Our Hope grant will be used to support this season.

Leadership, Vision and Governance

 The budget provides support for the Diocesan Bishop and two Suffragan Bishops through a ministry team that includes six archdeacons and other administrative support.





- Draft Canons are being presented to Synod to formally establish the governance structure that has been piloted over the course of 2022 and 2023.
- We are committed to continuing to explore new models of ministry that are emerging through the clustering of parish resources in urban and rural settings.
- The appointment of the new Diocesan Missioner will help us focus on planting and fostering new and innovative ministries

Creation Care, Justice and Reconciliation

- The Diocese will continue to move the down the road towards a path
 of creating a Church that seeks to dismantle racism and other forms
 of bias. The draft budgets for 2024 and 2025 includes a part-time
 role, similar to our current archdeacon role to facilitate this work.
- We will continue to deepen our commitment to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada: Calls to Action in every parish and ministry of the Diocese.
- We will support and challenge the Diocese to address the climate crisis through education, prayer, liturgy, and advocacy, in partnership with the wider Church. The Property Committee and the Bishop's Committee for Creation Care will work collaboratively to provide resources for parishes to reduce their own carbon footprint.
- We will continue to advocate for affordable housing at all levels of government and encourage the creation of affordable housing as part of parish redevelopment projects in the Diocese.
- We will advocate at all levels of government for adequate income supports, wages and working conditions that enable people to meet their basic needs and uphold human dignity and well-being.

Financial Stewardship

- We will continue to support clergy and lay leaders to speak about money with their congregations through educational stewardship programs provided by our Stewardship department and continue to encourage promoting wills, estates, and gifts of encouragement.
- We will work collaboratively with the Executive Director of the Anglican Diocese of Toronto Foundation to identify and support new stewardship resources.
- We will ensure that FaithWorks is promoted enthusiastically in all parishes and that every household in the Diocese is invited to participate.

Congregational Development & Mission

 Throughout 2024 and 2025, the Congregational Development will continue to work alongside congregations to facilitate visioning, priority setting, and planning.





- We will resource ministry and mission, sharing best practices from within the Diocese and the church nationally and internationally.
- We will continue to explore new regional models of ministry that look beyond the traditional parish model to help our churches better serve and support the spiritual, missional, and practical needs of their communities.
- We will continue to expand our understanding and support of immigrant/diaspora churches and our congregations of colour.
- We will continue to develop and expand our Diocesan volunteer corps to represent the full diversity of our Diocese, and to provide support for emerging diocesan priorities such as online ministries, regionalizions, and property developments.

Property and Administrative Resources

- Strengthening the bond between the Property Resources Department and parishes; promoting the department as an invaluable resource partner and trusted advisor, cultivating a proactive approach to property-related matters, and enriching the journey towards fulfilling our collective mission
- Undertake a comprehensive review of property-related processes and procedures, transforming them to be user-friendly, streamlined and accessible; thereby celebrating a seamless experience for everyone
- Aimed at nourishing and serving the diverse and ever-evolving needs
 of the Church and the broader community, we will chart an innovative
 path forward by crafting dynamic property strategies that harness the
 true potential of our real estate portfolio
- We will continue the digitalization of archival records. This process will help us retrieve information more efficiently, ensure the preservation of important and historical documents, and reduce storage space.
- We will explore providing cloud storage and security support in a standardized package available for purchase by each, relieving individual churches of the burden of managing this increasingly complex and risky task.

Communications

- We will continue to support Cast the Net, the Diocese's vision and strategy process, including the Season of Spiritual Renewal.
- We will continue to provide timely information, resources and support to clergy and laity of the Diocese through the website, The Anglican and social media channels such as Facebook, Instagram, and YouTube
- We will continue to support leadership and mission through the Bulletin Board.





 We will continue to produce the Bishop of Toronto's regular communications to the Diocese, including seasonal video messages and weekly letters.
