1. Please submit Vestry Motion response.

Nearly 50 parishes in our Diocese have already indicated their passage of this year's Social Justice Vestry Motion, "Standing in Solidarity." It has been wonderful to see the range of creative ideas and renewed interest in outreach and advocacy expressed across our Diocese. - **2.** Have your say on Waste Reduction (till April 20) Concerned about the amount of plastic pollution? Think producers should be responsible for the waste created by their products and packaging? The provincial government is seeking public input on these and other topics in its Discussion Paper on Reducing Litter and Waste in our Communities. You can read the paper and submit your comments here. The deadline for comment is just before midnight on Saturday, April 20.
- **3. Final push for Bill C-262.** Bill C-262, an Act to Implement the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, has passed through the House of Commons and is now in Second Reading in the Senate. Implementation of the UN Declaration is one of the key Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission and was the subject of our Social Justice Vestry Motion in 2017. Anglicans and other church leaders across Canada have been advocating for the passage of this Bill, which will die on the order paper if it is not passed before Parliament is dissolved for the federal election. Our ecumenical partners at KAIROS have prepared a new, urgent message to Senators urging them to support this Bill

- 4. Peel Lived Experience Table, April 4 and 11. The Peel Poverty Reduction Strategy (PPRS) is launching a table for residents of Peel with lived experience of poverty. It is their aim to equip, mobilize and empower this group to be champions for change and to bring awareness to an issue which affects over 12.8% of Peel's population. - **3.** Good Friday Ecumenical Walk for Justice, April 19 (Toronto) The 40th annual Good Friday Ecumenical Walk for Justice begins at Holy Trinity Church, Trinity Square, Toronto, at 2 p.m. on Good Friday, April 19. The walk processes through several stations, connecting present-day injustices with the suffering and death of Jesus, before returning to Holy Trinity for a simple common meal. All are welcome.
- **4. Earth Sunday and other Environmental resources.** The Creation Matters committee has produced a number of resources to help you and your parish observe a "Green Lent" and celebrate Earth Sunday in Eastertide. (Lectionary reflections for Earth Sunday will be posted by April 5, 2019). Our new Policy Paper on Environmental Issues, recently received by Diocesan Council, and a reflection paper, "World of Wonder," from the Rev. Dr. Stephen Drakeford, are also available on our Environmental Resources page.
- **5.** York-Simcoe Advocacy Workshops, April 25 and 27 (Orillia/Georgina.) A number of parishes are responding to this year's Vestry Motion by hosting workshops exploring the connection between outreach and advocacy, and how advocacy is a part of our church's public witness.
