1. Register now for Outreach Conference on October 19th

2. August Events of Interest

- Sin Fronteras Monarch Butterfly Project, Aug. 22-Sept. 4, Gardiner Museum, Toronto. In August 2018, the Davenport-Perth Community Centre in West Toronto ran a KAIROS Blanket Exercise with many Spanish-speaking seniors. The experiences of Indigenous peoples in Canada resonated with the seniors, many of whom shared their experiences of being displaced from their traditional territories in due to Canadian mining practices abroad. Using the migratory (and at-risk) Monarch butterfly as a metaphor, members of the community have used ceramic art to tell their stories of displacement, migration, and resilience. All welcome. - Stand against Hate, August 31. Anti-Islam/anti-migrant organization Pegida, a branch of an international far-right organization, has been organizing demonstrations in Toronto and attempting to intimidate local Muslims. Their next rally is planned for

Saturday, August 31. Anyone interested in being part of a non-violent counterdemonstration to show solidarity with our friends and neighbours at Masjid Toronto should contact the <u>Rev. Maggie Helwig</u> for details.

3. Season of Creation Resources available

Over the last few decades, Christians of various denominations around the world have increasingly come to observe a Season of Creation from Sept. 1 through October 4. At General Synod earlier this month, the Anglican Church of Canada voted overwhelmingly (91%) to "adopt the Season of Creation in the Anglican Church of Canada as an annual time of prayer, education, and action" on creation care, and to "encourage dioceses to engage with the Season of Creation and to develop initiatives, resources, and suitably authorized liturgies for use during the season." Resources to help you observe this season in your own parish will be added to the <u>Anglican Church of Canada website</u> by early August. Also, watch for a special video statement from Bishop Andrew Asbil on our Diocesan website on August 28!

4. Federal Election Resources

The federal election is less than 3 months away. Our choices as citizens in this election will set the agenda for how we address climate change, protect the environment, welcome refugees and newcomers, and reduce poverty - over the next four years and beyond. Citizens for Public Justice, an ecumenical advocacy organization based in Ottawa, has prepared a free election bulletin which you can download or order from their website.

<u>GreenPAC</u>, a non-partisan, non-profit organization devoted to supporting strong environmental leaders from all parties, is planning to hold 100 debates on environmental issues in 100 ridings across Canada on October 7, 2019. 5. Election Conversation with Michael Coren, Sept. 11, Toronto

St. Timothy, North Toronto (100 Old Orchard Grove) is hosting a conversation on "Election issues from a Christian perspective" with best-selling author, columnist and speaker Michael Coren, on Wednesday, Sept. 11 from 7-9 p.m. All welcome.

6. Save the Date: Climate Action September 27 Young people around the world have begun to participate in the "Fridays for Future" climate strikes started by Swedish teen activist Greta Thunberg. A particularly significant action is planned for Friday, September 27, during the UN debates on climate action. The GTA chapter of Fridays for Future is planning a local climate action (with police approval), which will have a non-partisan focus on federal climate action and a Green New Deal for Canada. and for St. Paul, Newmarket, its support of the local food bank and Inn from the Cold program, Karanda Mission Hospital in Zimbabwe, Elimu education programs in Kenya, and school knapsacks for St. Vincent and the Grenadines.
