1. Advocacy Campaigns

- Provincial Budget Consultations: As part of the provincial pre-budget process, the Standing Committee on Finance and Economic Affairs is holding public hearings throughout Ontario this month. As is our practice, our office will be making a submission on behalf of the Diocesan Bishop and this will be posted on our website as soon as it is available.
- City of Toronto Budget Consultations: The City of Toronto is holding public hearings on its 2020 Budget on Monday, January 20 and Tuesday, January 21, at locations downtown and in Etobicoke, North York, and Scarborough. - **Provincial Poverty Reduction Strategy Consultations**: Every five years, the Ontario government consults on and updates its Poverty Reduction Strategy.
