#### 1. Vestry Motion Campaign - Please report back!

Thank you to all the parishes which presented and considered this year's Social Justice Vestry Motion, "Taking Action on Climate Change," at your recent Vestry meetings. If you haven't already done so, please take the time to <u>let us know</u> of the results of the Vestry Motion in your parish, including any changes to the wording of the motion as well as the particular actions your parish has committed to undertake. Your feedback is valuable to us!

## 2. Give It Up for Lent Campaign - Thanks and Update

What a great response! One thousand "Give It Up For the Earth" postcards have been distributed to nearly 30 parishes in our Diocese! These postcards invite individuals to commit to a personal action to reduce their own carbon footprint as well as calling on the federal government to invest in a just transition and decarbonization strategy for Canada. They require no postage and can simply be dropped in any mailbox when filled out. submission that will be uploaded to the Diocesan website by March 9, 2020.

## 4. Events in March:

Many parishes are holding Lenten study programs on themes of social and/or ecological justice, and welcome all with an interest in these topics. Here are a sampling - perhaps there are similar programs near you.

- Living the Gospel at St. Martin in-the-Fields (151 Glenlake Avenue, Toronto) Wednesday evenings at 7:30 p.m., March 4-April 1. Each evening will feature a guest speaker on topics such as: charity and justice; income security and housing; migrants and refugees; and Indigenous justice.
- **Caring for our Common Home at St. Aidan** (2423 Queen St. E., Toronto) Thursday evenings at 7:30 p.m., March 5-April 2. This series explores the nature of the environmental crisis, what movements are making a difference, and how the church can respond.
- Living our Faith at St. George Memorial Church (39 Athol St., Oshawa) Wednesday evenings at 7:00 p.m., March 4-April 1. Speakers will present on homelessness, mental health, HIV/AIDS, and local neighbourhood concerns. Includes a screening of the documentary "Doctrine of Discovery: Stolen Lands, Strong Hearts" on March 25, 2020, cohosted by the Canadian Federation of University Women. Popcorn will be provided! Donations gratefully accepted.

## 5. Looking Ahead:

- Voices for Peace Conference, April 24/25. "Spirituality, Justice, and the Land." Held at the Cardinal Flahiff Basilian Centre (95 St. Joseph St., Toronto), this conference begins on Friday evening and continues all day Saturday, with keynote addresses from John Dear, Sylvia Keesmaat, and Andrew and Esther Wesley. Tickets are \$75 before Mar. 31/\$95 after; \$25 for students and include a reception Friday night as well as breakfast, lunch, and refreshments on Saturday. *for* St. Andrew, Scarborough, its monthly Neighbourhood Lunch, support for foster children and their communities in Haiti and Zimbabwe, "We Care" Christmas bags for the homeless, and support for such programs as the St. Jude, Wexford Food Bank, All Saints Community Centre, and the Pikangikum Water project;

*and for* St. Anne, Toronto, its monthly community dinners and its refugee sponsorship.

**March 29, Lent 5** - *Pray for* St. Athanasius, Orillia, and its support of the Good Food box;

*for* St. Augustine of Canterbury, its support of the Flemingdon Park Ministry and Community Food Bank, All Saints Sherbourne, Moorelands Camp, and other community projects;

*and for* St. Barnabas, Chester, its participation in the interfaith "Chew on This" initiative, Prayer Shawl ministry, support of Kennedy House Youth Centre; provision of space for new and emerging musicians, its support of local artists through hosting the Riverdale Art Show, and refugee sponsorship.
