- 1. Save the Date: Our first wholly-virtual Outreach & Advocacy Conference will take place on Saturday, October 24, 2020. - **3. Event Thursday, June 11:** "Shaping a Just Recovery in Davenport: A Community Conversation" is a free, online event co-hosted by St. Anne's Anglican Church, Green Wave West and the Davenport Mutual Aid Network. It will take place on Zoom next Thursday, June 11, 2020, from 7:00 to 8:15 p.m. Registration is required through Eventbrite.
- **4. Support Our Outreach Ministries:** As the COVID-19 shutdown continues, our FaithWorks ministry partners and many of our parishes continue to deliver life-giving outreach programs to those in need. The pandemic has meant many of them face extra costs in terms of protective equipment, food supplies, additional cleaning, etc. If you are in a position to be able to help sustain these ministries, or to increase the donations you are already making, they would undoubtedly appreciate the financial support. **Note: Please do not make in-kind donations unless the parish or ministry has specifically requested them:** sorting, storing and disposing of in-kind donations takes staff time and energy and storage space that is in short supply. Contact your local parish to find out how you can help.

5. Advocacy Campaigns

- Long-Term Care Homes Inquiry: Many of us have been grieved at reports of the conditions in long-term care homes in Ontario. The Social Justice and Advocacy Committee has endorsed letters from the Ontario Health Coalition and from the Interfaith Social Assistance Reform Coalition (ISARC) calling for independence, transparency and accountability in the provincial inquiry into long-term care, as well as measures to address immediate concerns. Please consider endorsing these letters or using them to write the Premier and your own MPP.
- Call for a Guaranteed Basic Income: On May 3, 2020, over 40 bishops of the Anglican Church of Canada and Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada sent a <u>letter</u> to the Prime Minister and federal cabinet ministers calling for a guaranteed basic income in Canada. You can find more background information as well as a template letter to your MP to add your support on our Diocesan website.
- Stand up for Tenants' Rights: Although we are still in the midst of a pandemic, and many renters have lost income, the provincial government has passed second reading of Bill 184, the "Protecting Tenants and Strengthening Community Act," which has now been referred to the Standing Committee on Social Policy. Despite the name, the Bill does not offer significant protection to tenants, as the Advocacy Centre for Tenants Ontario (ACTO) has pointed out. The Social Justice & Advocacy Committee and Housing Advocacy

Subcommittee are working on a letter calling for substantial protections for Ontario tenants to be added to this Bill before it is passed. Please check our website by June 15 for more details.

June 7, Trinity - *Pray for* St. John the Baptist, Oak Ridges, and its Friday Soup's On community lunch;

for St. John the Divine, Scarborough, its support of St. Ninian's food bank, Juliette's Place women's shelter, and international initiatives;

and for St. John the Evangelist, Peterborough, its garden club, its management of the Warming Room Community Ministry, its One Roof dinner every Monday to Friday, its support of the St. John Centre housing for seniors, and advocacy for social justice.

June 14, Pentecost 2 - *Pray for* St. John the Evangelist, Port Hope, its Treasure Trove second-hand shop, and its support of the Fairshare food bank, Green Wood Coalition, Community Care, and Neighbour Link;

for St. John, Bowmanville, its community garden, Christmas hamper program, and support of Durham Region Migrant Worker ministry;

and for St. John, East Orangeville, its community suppers, men's breakfast, support of a school in Guatemala, Dufferin Child and Family Services, Family Transition House, and the local food bank.

June 21, Pentecost 3 - *Pray for* St. John, Ida (Parish of Ida & Omemee), its involvement with the One Roof Community Diner in downtown Peterborough, monthly seniors lunch, refugee support, and its support of the Pikangikum Water Project and education for reconciliation;

for St. John, West Toronto, its youth drop-in, weekly community meals, involvement in neighbourhood food security programs, and refugee sponsorship; and for St. John, Whitby, its community garden, support of local outreach organizations and the Pikangikum water project.

June 28, Pentecost 4 - *Pray for* St. John, Willowdale, and its refugee sponsorship; *for* St. John, York Mills, its support of Flemingdon Park Ministry, New Circles Community Services, Robertson House, and the Downsview Youth Covenant, its monthly breakfast, participation in refugee resettlement, and its Friends of Dismas ministry to prisoners and ex-prisoners;

and for St. Joseph of Nazareth, Bramalea, its connection with ministry to ex-inmates, its new food bank, and its Diaconal Committee for outreach.
