 - 2. Biblical Pastoral Model Small group ministry
 - a. Old Testament Moses led Israelites in Sinai wilderness (Exodus 18:13-27, Numbers 11:16)
 - i. 70 Elders → Chiefs of thousands → Chief of hundreds → Chiefs of fifties → Chiefs of tens
 - b. New Testament The Early Church
 - i. Peter \rightarrow 12 Apostles \rightarrow 120 disciples \rightarrow believers
 - c. In today's banquet of hundreds or thousands, we also sit in a group of 10
 - 3. Characteristics of a small group
 - It is important to format your small group gathering
 - a. Ice-breaking (singsong, checking in, simple games)
 - b. Bible Study/ topical discussion
 - c. Sharing
 - d. Prayer time
